HISTORY OF THE "SCOTTY DOG" TIE


Members of WIP who achieve certification as a Fellow of Interventional Pain Practice (FIPP) earn the privilege of wearing the FIPP tie.



This attractive maroon tie bearing the "Scotty Dog" emblem originated from a belief that all candidates for the FIPP would identify with the eye of the Scotty Dog, which is symbolic of a target for radiofrequency denervation procedures for facet joint pain.

Designed by Ms. Hilary Hodgson, clothing designer and **Dr. Philip Finch, MBBS, FIPP**, modifications to the design led to a bow tie and ladies' silk scarf, also bearing the "Scotty Dog" emblem.

The original tie, bow tie, and ladies' silk scarf have proven to be popular and are worn by FIPPs at dinners and special occasions.
